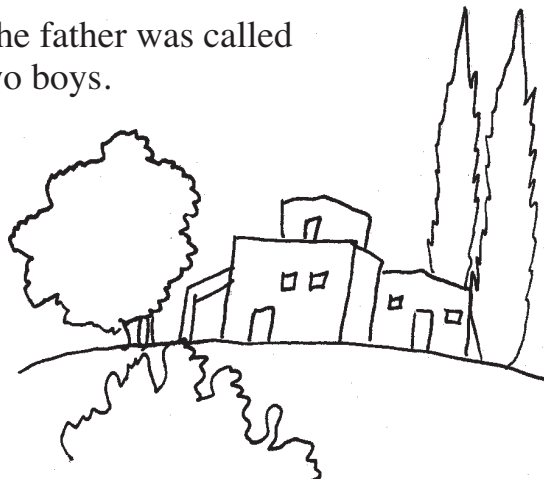
Ruth 1
