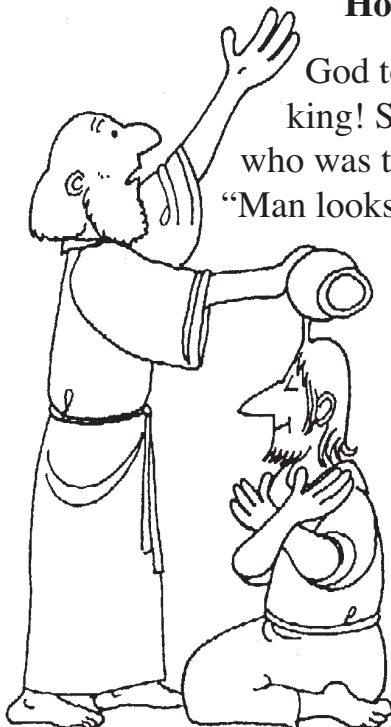
1 Samuel 16: 1-13

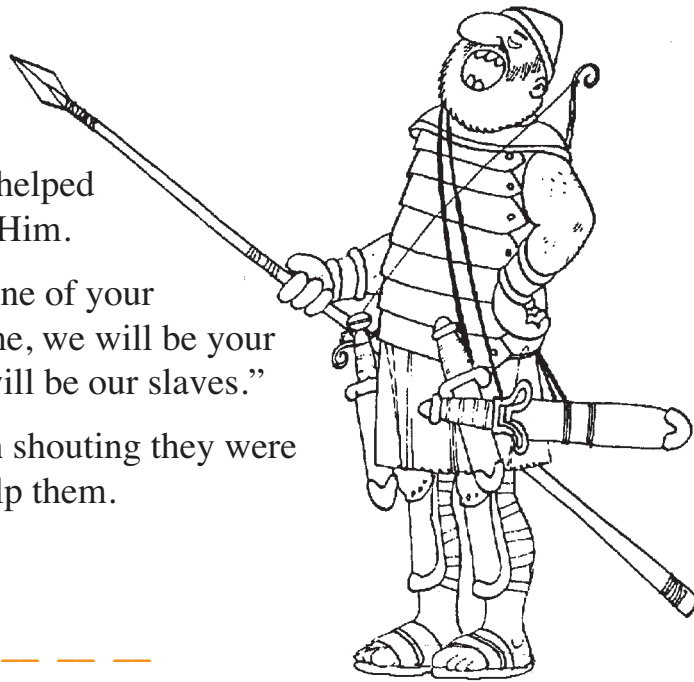

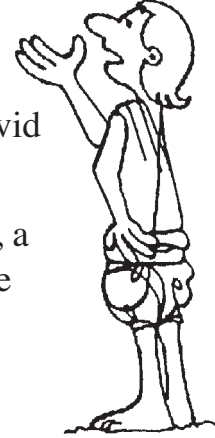

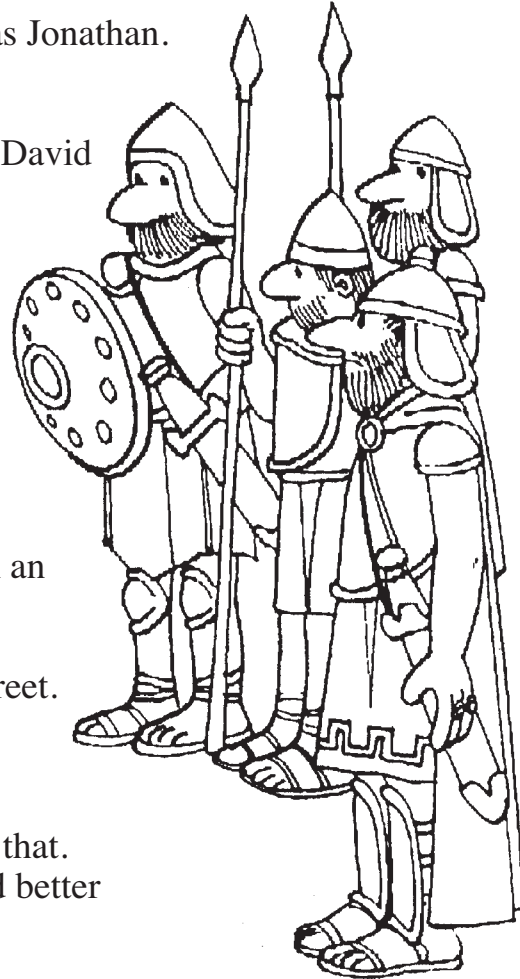
