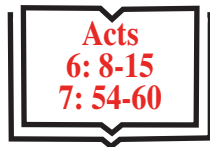

One of the helpers in the church there was Stephen. He was a good man who served the Lord Jesus by helping other people. He was full of the Holy Spirit and often preached about Jesus.

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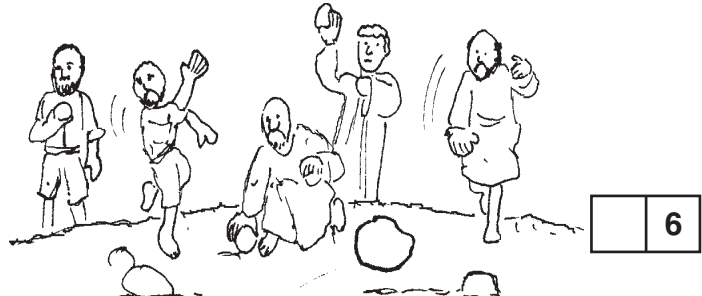
Some Jewish men did not like Stephen preaching about Jesus. They took Stephen to court where there were men who told lies about him. Even though Stephen was having a hard time, he was not afraid. No matter what these men said or did to him, the Lord Jesus would always be with him. The angry men noticed how peaceful Stephen was - the Bible tells us that his face looked like that of an angel!

Stephen spoke to all the people gathered in the court. He reminded them that they had killed Jesus. This made them furious. Stephen looked up to Heaven and saw a bright light. "I can see Jesus standing at the right hand of God", he exclaimed. He was thrilled to see into Heaven, but his enemies were more angry than ever!

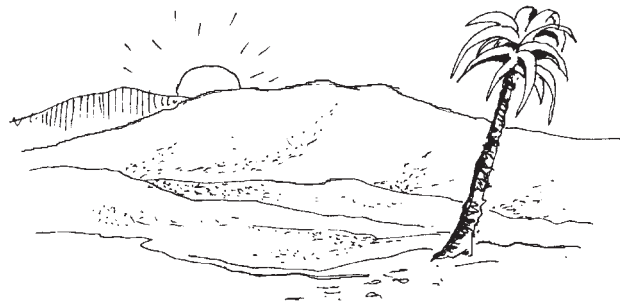
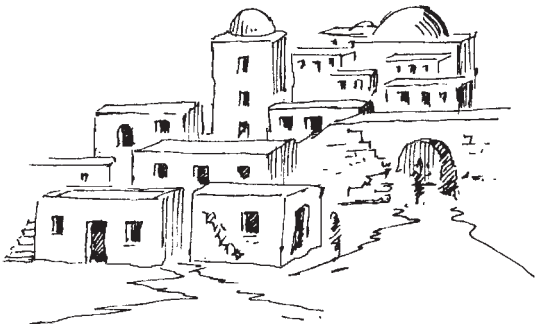

Colour the picture which shows where Philip was sent.

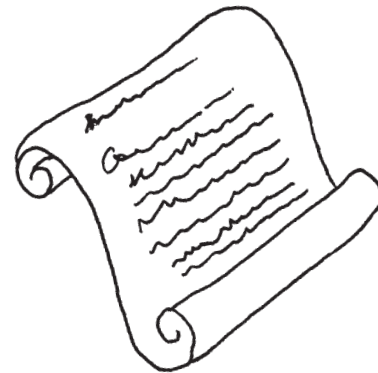

"Saul, Saul, why do you persecute Me?" a voice said.

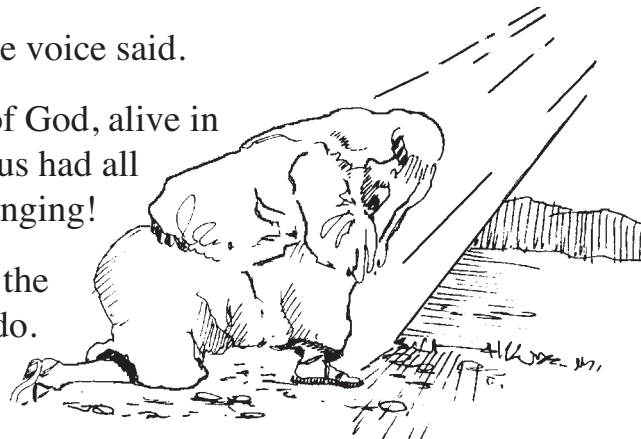
"Who are you, Lord?" answered Saul, feeling frightened and confused.

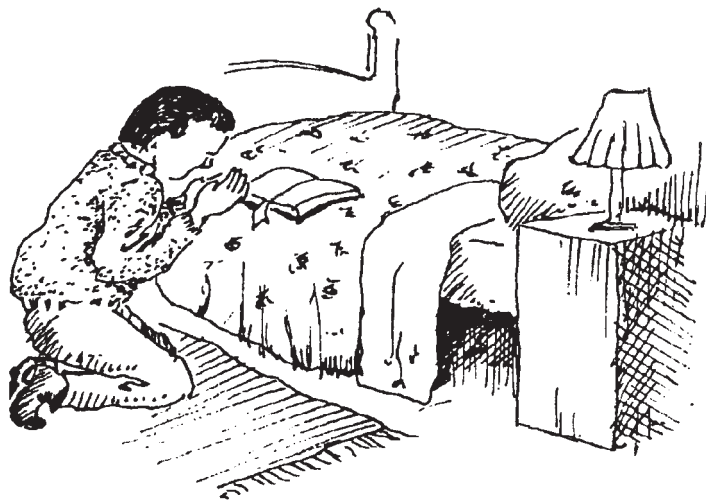

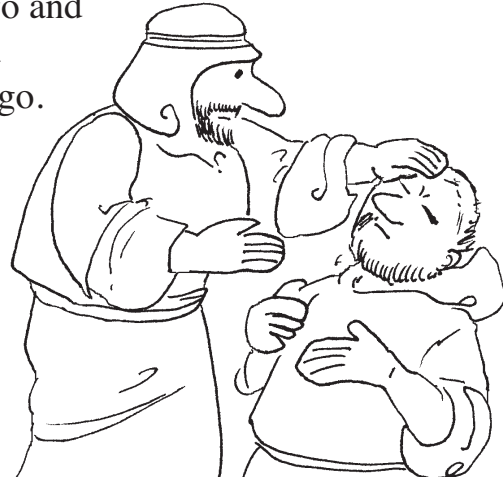
