Lesson No. 1 - God gives food to the Israelites

John 6: 35 Ask somebody to help you find this verse

How good God had been to the Israelites! It's hard to believe that soon they were grumbling. They had eaten all the food they had brought with them, so they complained to Moses. They told him that they wouldn't have been hungry if they had stayed in Egypt.

What a pity they couldn't trust God to help them! He had a special plan to see that His people would always have food to eat.

On the sixth day of the week they were to collect twice as much, to last them for the Sabbath day (God's special day). Each evening, God would also give them meat. (See verse 13.)







The people called the special bread 'Manna'. It must have been good to eat because the Bible says it tasted like honey! God sent the manna to the Israelites for as long as their journey lasted.

Soon the Israelites had another problem. An enemy army, called the Amalekites, started attacking them. The Israelites would have to fight back, so Moses told his helper, Joshua, to choose an army.



Moses, Aaron and Hur went to the top of a hill overlooking the battlefield. Moses took the rod of God which he held up between his hands. This was a way of showing that the Israelites were trusting God to help them win.

As long as Moses did this, the Israelites were winning, but when his hands dropped, the enemy was winning. If you held both hands above your head for a long time you would feel your arms becoming tired!

So did Moses, but Aaron and Hur found a big stone for him to sit on. They helped to hold up his arms till sunset. By that time the Israelites had won!

Moses had the most important part in the battle - more important than Joshua or all the soldiers. The battle was won because he was lifting up his hands to God, depending on God for help. God gave the Israelites victory because they trusted in Him.









After some more travelling, the people came to a large mountain called Sinai, where they set up camp. This was the place where God would meet with Moses to give him commandments, or rules, for all the Israelites to keep.



God explained that He would come down in a thick cloud to the top of the mountain. 
The people were unable to keep God's commandments. We are all sinners and have broken God's commandments. No matter how hard we try, we still sin and cannot please God.




