Have you ever made a promise to behave yourself for a whole day? Have you ever managed to keep it? Perhaps you are very good at obeying the rules at home or at school, but it is impossible to be perfect. God's standards, set out in the Ten Commandments, are even higher than the standards set for us by those who love and take care of us.
