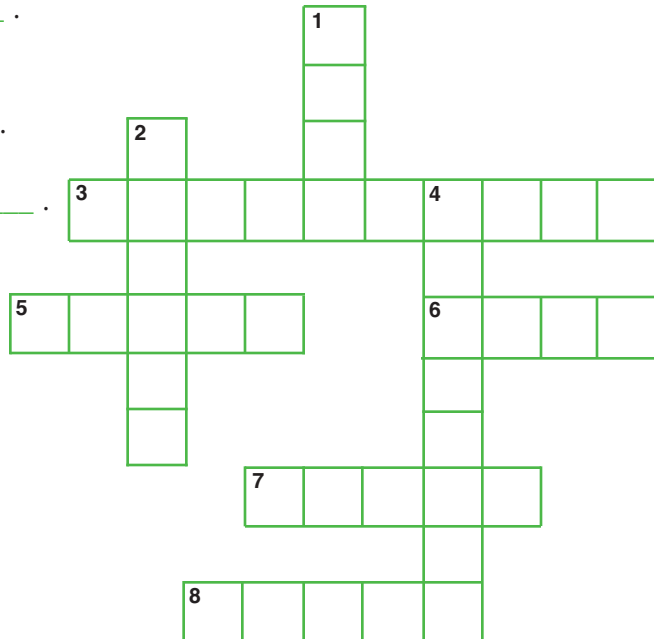

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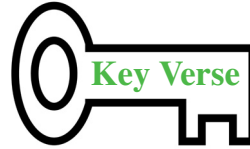

By completing the Word Ladder you will learn about what the Wise Men did before they found the young Child.

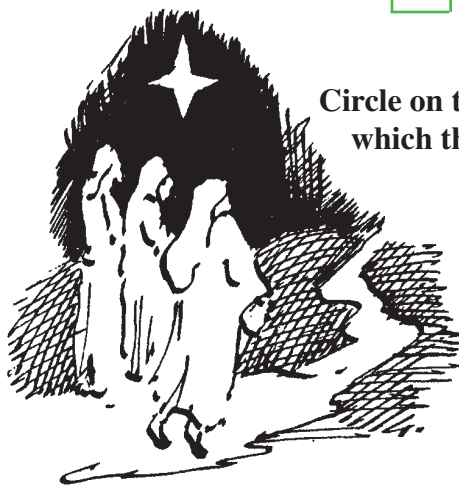

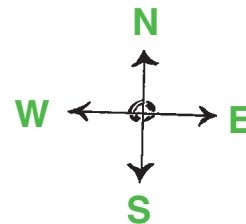

Explain, IN YOUR OWN WORDS, what the special star did.

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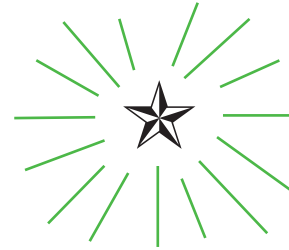
