Luke 19: 1-10





As a rule, tax collectors were very unpopular, because they were often dishonest, taking more money from the people than was required. Besides, they were looked upon as 'traitors' because they worked for the hated Romans. Zacchaeus, apparently, was tired of his dishonest ways and longed for a new and better life.

Perhaps Zacchaeus wondered if the Lord Jesus would take such a sinful, hated man to be one of His followers. He very soon found out!

Write out what Jesus said when He stopped at the tree.

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These words teach us that the Lord Jesus loves us, even though we are sinners, and He is willing to change us, if we sincerely want to turn away from our sins.

Now Zacchaeus has to decide how to respond to what the Lord Jesus had said to him. Would he OBEY Him or IGNORE Him?

Write out the verse which tells us what he did.

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It was a wise decision! Have you ‘received Him’ into your life, as Lord and Saviour? (Read [John 1: 12.](#))

That day, Zacchaeus reached a ‘crossroads’ in his life. What he said (in verse 8) shows us that he would now be a changed man. As a follower of the Lord Jesus, his behaviour would be different. What Jesus said to him (in verses 9 and 10) shows that He had welcomed and ‘saved’ the tax collector!

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Lesson No. 2 - Jesus meets a woman at a well

Read verse 9 and write the name of the group. S _ _ _ _ _ S


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On this occasion, Jesus was passing through Samaria and came to a town.

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The Jews despised these people, and would have nothing to do with them because they were a mixed race, and not pure blooded Jews. But the Lord Jesus was different. He loves ALL, no matter what colour or race they may be! Let us see how He treated the Samaritan woman.



Cross out ALL THE WRONG WORDS in these sentences.

Because He was tired, the Lord Jesus sat by a TREE / RIVER / WELL.

The woman came along to LOOK FOR HER SHEEP / TO GET SOME WATER / TO WASH HER CLOTHES.


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Just then, the Lord Jesus changed the subject.





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In talking to him, the Lord Jesus said repeatedly that it is necessary to be "BORN AGAIN" if we wish to be in "God's kingdom".

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Nicodemus became quite mixed up! Did Jesus mean that he had to become a tiny baby all over again, and have another birth just like his first one?

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That idea is altogether wrong! What, then, did Jesus mean by being "born again"? Think! What happened when you were born? The answer is - YOU BEGAN YOUR LIFE! When a person is "BORN AGAIN", he or she receives a NEW LIFE, a life different from that natural life which we each received from our parents.

What word does verse 16 use to describe this new life?

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So, to be "BORN AGAIN" means to have GOD'S LIFE, which is far better and never ending. God offers it to us as a free gift. (Read [Romans 6: 23](#).)

We see how divided they were in their opinions about Jesus. It is still the same today. Some are 'FOR' Him, and some are 'AGAINST' Him. Perhaps you wonder, "Does it really matter?" Read what **John 3: 36** says about it. In which part of the verse are YOU?

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The result was that the Jewish leaders threw him out of their synagogue (verses 22 & 34). He was finding out that it isn't always an easy thing to believe in the Lord Jesus, and to confess Him before others. But when no one else wanted him, the Lord Jesus was his TRUE FRIEND. Jesus came to him and helped him to understand and believe.
