Ruth's task was very simple, very ordinary and very tiring, but she did it faithfully. God expects us to do our best in everything, just as Ruth did.

She was very moved by Boaz's kindness to her, and she felt she didn't deserve it, as she was a foreigner. (See verse 10.)

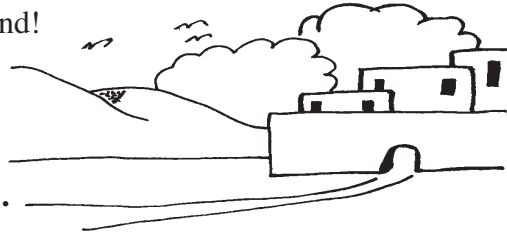

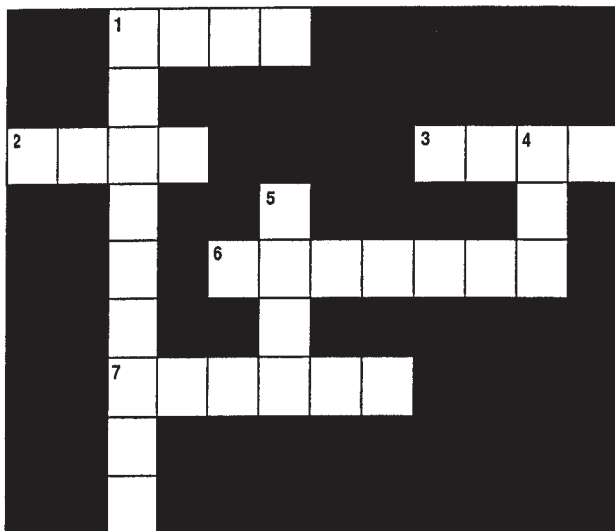

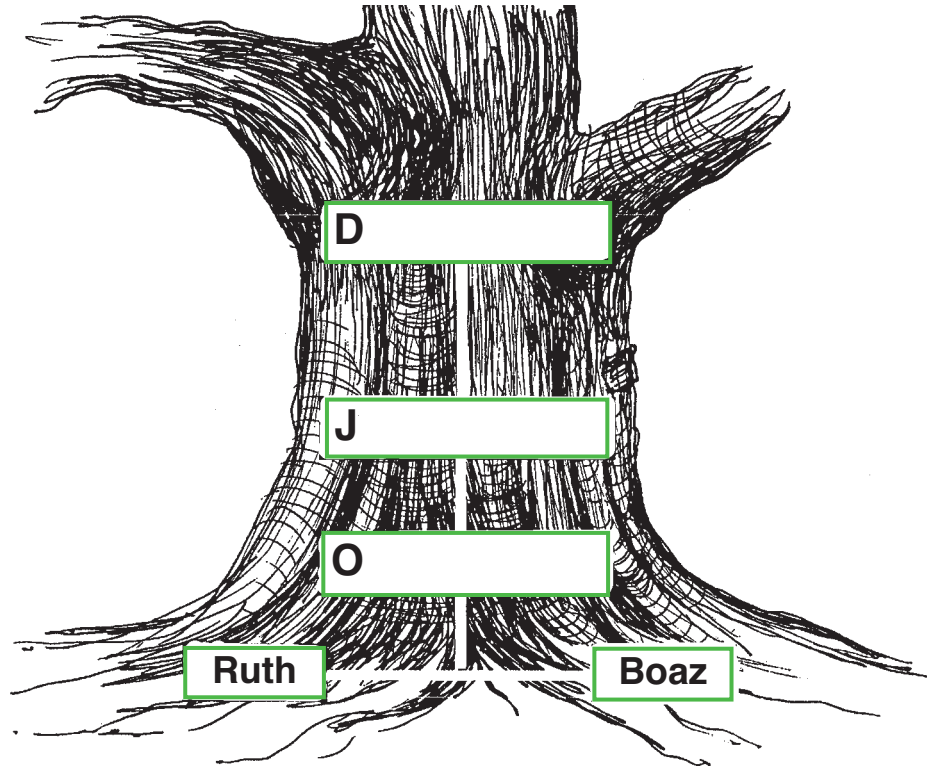
