This series of lessons is about one of Israel's greatest prophets, Elijah. He lived at a time when it was very hard to worship God, and to obey and serve Him. Part of the problem was the king who reigned in Israel at this time.

Read 1 Kings 16: 29-33 carefully, then underline the correct answers in the brackets.

He turned his people away from the Lord, and encouraged them to worship a false god called (ETHBAAL / OMRI / BAAL).

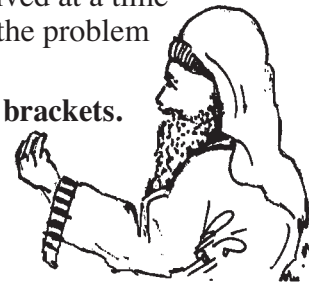
