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There are some words which are repeated over and over again in [Genesis 1](#). This shows that they must be important.

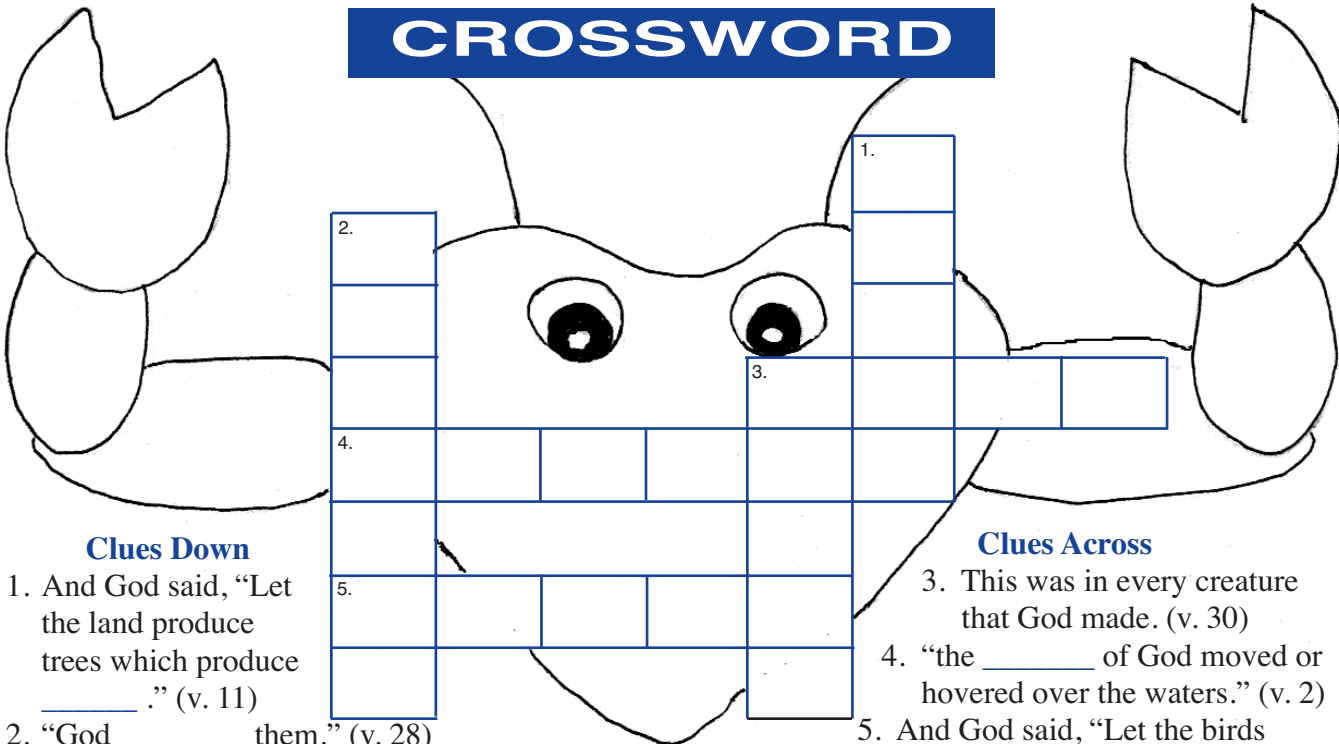
