Each year, the Jews celebrated their release from slavery in Egypt by a festival called the Passover. It was while the Lord Jesus and His disciples were celebrating this festival that He introduced the 'Lord's Supper'. (This is also known as 'Communion' or the 'Breaking of Bread'.) He used bread as a symbol of His body given for them, and a cup of wine to represent His blood, which was shed for them. (See [Luke 22: 13-20](#).)

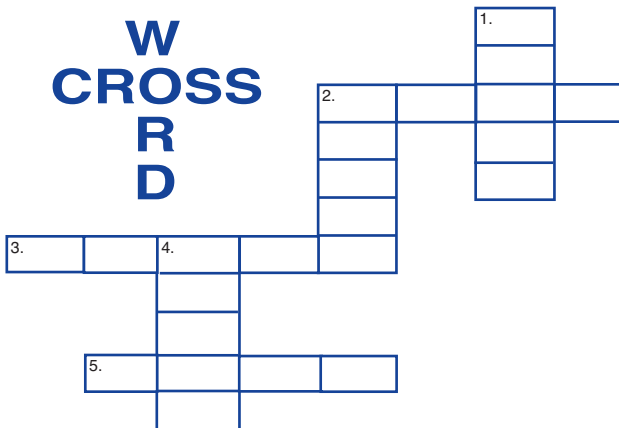

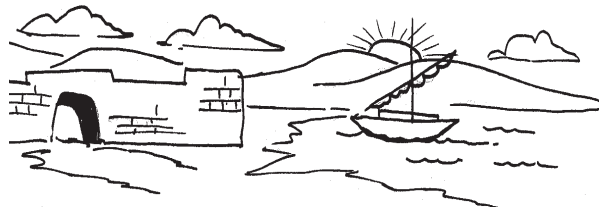
