Simon, the Pharisee, had made up his mind that Jesus was not a prophet. It must have come as a great surprise to him when he discovered that the Lord Jesus knew exactly what he was thinking! The Lord Jesus knew his thoughts because, **Jesus is God.**

The Lord Jesus knows our thoughts too!

The parable Jesus then told Simon is only a small part of our Bible Reading (verses 41 to 43).

A parable is a story about ordinary, everyday things but with a deeper meaning about God and His ways.

Let's think about the deeper meaning of the parable. Read verses 41 to 43 again.

The money lender (creditor) represents God. The two men could be any two people. However, one has lived a far more sinful life than the other and so 'owes' God more. But neither is able to pay his debt to God. God forgives them both completely, but the one who has had the greater forgiveness by God feels more gratitude and love towards God.


Not only that, but he promised to pay any more that was needed when he returned that way.


