The Israelites lived in Egypt for a total of 430 years, to the very day. (Exodus 12: 40 & 41) Now Moses had led them out of Egypt, on the night of the Passover, but that was not the end of the story. In fact, it was the beginning of a new era in the life of the Israelites. But their troubles were not over! They had escaped from their slavery in Egypt, but their old taskmasters were not letting them go that easily!

It is the same when we become Christians. We start a new life under the control of a new Master, the Lord Jesus. But Satan does not give up on us easily. He wants to drag us back to our old way of life, but with God's help we can gain the victory. God did not lead the Israelites to the Promised Land by the shortest route, as this would have taken them through the land of a certain hostile nation.

The Israelites' first three months of freedom were certainly eventful. First of all, there was the miraculous crossing of the Red Sea and the death of the Egyptian army. After that, Moses and the Israelites sang a song of praise and thanksgiving to God before moving on. For three days they found no water and when they eventually came to Marah, the waters were bitter and they could not drink them. Again, God performed a miracle through Moses and made the waters sweet. God also provided them with food in the desert. Then the Amalekites came to fight the Israelites, but with God's help the Israelites won. (Exodus 17)

We now come to a very important part of the journey when they came to Mount Sinai and God gave the Ten Commandments to the people.

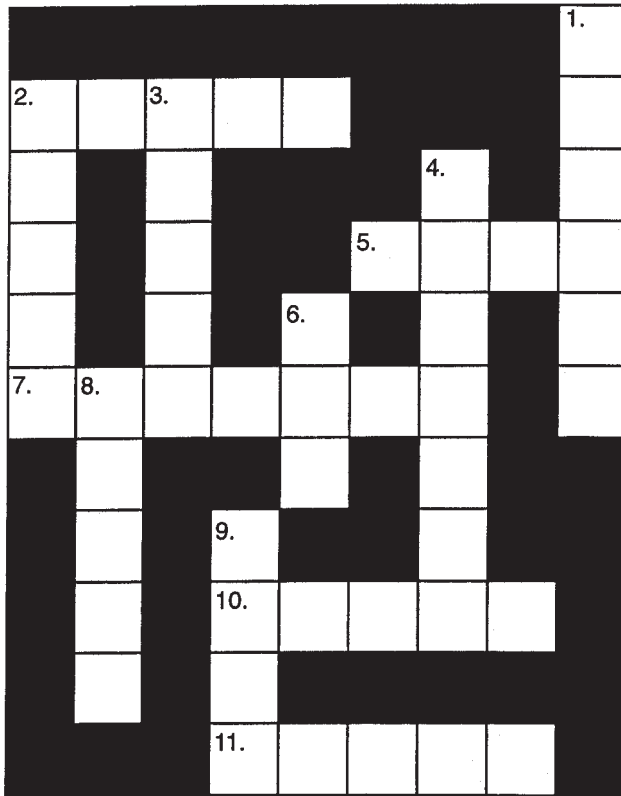

The book of Numbers tells the story of the Israelites during almost forty years from the time they left Mount Sinai until they reached the eastern border of the land that God had promised to give them. It records how they were often afraid and discouraged when hardship came, and how they often rebelled against God and Moses. It highlights God’s faithful, persistent care for His people in spite of their weakness and disobedience. It also shows Moses’ devotion to God and to His people.
