
1) Physical or Natural Death.

This takes place when, like Lazarus, our bodies become ill and die.



2) Spiritual Death.

This is the result of sin. It means separation from God. If we die with our sins unforgiven, we will be separated from Him and be for ever under His punishment.



Even though the end of our life comes and we die, if we have trusted in the Lord Jesus then we shall go to be with Him for ever in Heaven. For Christians, death is not the end of life. See Philippians 1: 21-23.

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

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
