
*In those days some men had more than one wife, but this was never God’s plan. He always intended that a man should have only one wife. See Matthew 19: 5 & 6.*







Joseph's new coat was the sort of garment only worn by noblemen who did not have to work, and was normally worn by wealthy men. Jacob was putting Joseph above his brothers.
