

From this time on until David became king, he was a hunted man. Yet twice he spared Saul's life when he could have easily killed him. (See 1 Samuel 24 and 26.) Then one day David heard the tragic news that both Saul and Jonathan had died in battle. As a result, he was made king, first over Judah (2 Samuel 2) and then over the whole of Israel, reigning in all for 40 years and 6 months.



Our second Bible Reading is an account of something which David did during his reign. One day he was thinking about the promise he had made some years before to Jonathan.
