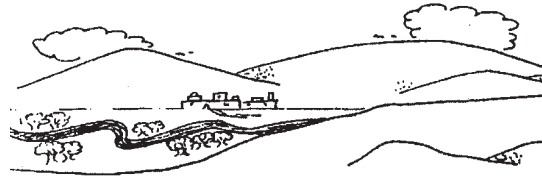

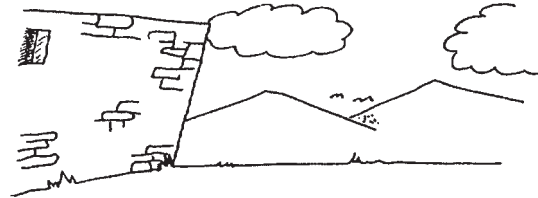

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We can be sure the spies were very frightened when they heard the king's men questioning Rahab about them! Later on, as Rahab talked to the spies, it became clear that she, too, was very anxious and worried.

Read verses 8-11 carefully, and write ONE sentence about what was making Rahab so afraid.

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At the heart of her fear is the fact that she, a sinful Gentile woman, had come to believe that the God of Israel is the one and only God, and that His punishment was about to come upon the wicked city where she lived. She knows that the false gods of Jericho cannot save her, or her city, from the doom that is about to befall them. For this reason, she is very concerned about the future safety of herself and her relatives.

We, too, should understand that because we are sinners in the sight of God, we need to be saved from God's punishment upon our sins.

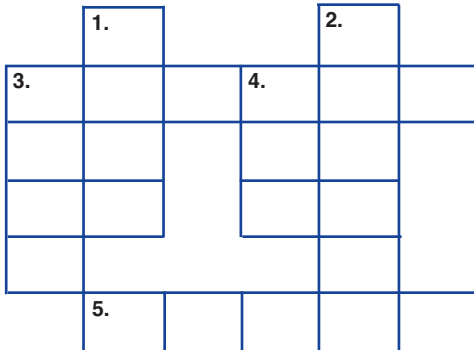

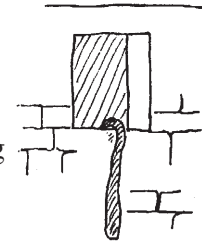

There He took the punishment which we deserved. God’s great plan for delivering us is stated in [Romans 5: 6](#).

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Wisely, Rahab agreed with the spies’ plan. (See verse 21.) The red cord was tied in the window, and she and her family waited inside the house until the Israelite army began their great attack upon the city.



This shows us her FAITH - first in God, and then in what the spies had told her. Having faith in God means TRUSTING Him, depending completely on what He has said.

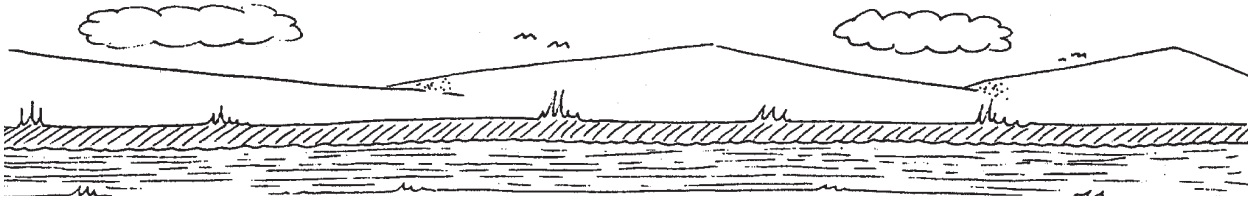

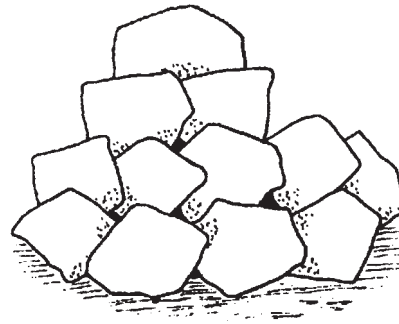

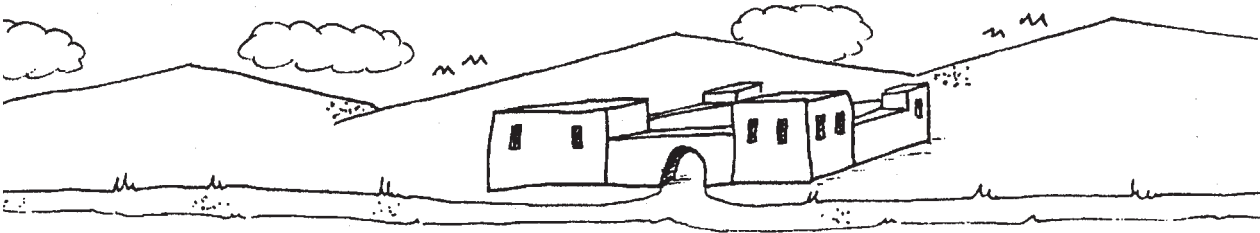
